An emphasis will be placed on the interactions between these regions as they involve colonization practices, decolonization movements, the effects on nationalism, and the rise of globalization.

#### OBJECTIVES

The overriding goals of this course are that you will gain a thorough understanding of this world history. Such an understanding will develop an ongoing appreciation of the complex pieces of the body politic and an assessment of the social and cultural effects of historical events on mainstream national and marginalized groups and individuals. Critical analysis of the materials under study is essential for the fulfillment of other goals.

1. You will be able to acquire and retain a broad factual knowledge concerning the period under study.
2. You will understand the various interpretations of important issues in world history.
3. Students will identify, critically evaluate, and interpret 20<sup>th</sup> century world history primary documents to construct historical analysis. Assessment: written evaluation and interpretation of primary documents.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes (2):**

1. Students will demonstrate and apply knowledge of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century to construct defensible statements of meaning an evaluation about this period’s developments.

Assessments: on-line assignments, on-line exams.

2. Students will identify, critically evaluate, and interpret 20<sup>th</sup> Century primary documents to construct historical analysis. Assessment: written evaluation and/or interpretation of primary documents.
