Course Description: This class emphasizes the development of listening and speaking skills for English as a Second Language learners. The emphasis is put on listening comprehension and proficiency in speaking in academic settings and expression of students' ideas using a variety of speaking strategies. Development of vocabulary and academic note-taking skills are also essential components of ESL 251 course.

1. Demonstrate understanding of essential points of discussions or speeches on selected topics.
2. Recognize and demonstrate level-appropriate spoken American English in class discussions and speeches on selected topics.
